## *Innovative Care Since 1913*



For over 100 years Goshen Health has provided comprehensive health care close to home. Since its inception November 29, 1913, Goshen Health has grown from a 25 bed community hospital created to care for the sick and injured, to a health system that provides many specialty services, as well as preventative treatment options.

Goshen Health now includes a 122 bed hospital, Goshen Center for Cancer Care, Goshen Heart & Vascular Center, Goshen Home Care and Hospice, Goshen Home Medical Equipment, Goshen Orthopedic and Sports Medicine, Goshen Physicians Family Medicine & Urgent Care, Goshen Retreat Women's Health Center, Goshen Wound Center, Team:Bariatrics and Indiana Lakes Managed Care Organization. We are an award-winning health system recognized locally and nationally for innovation, excellence in patient care, and Colleague workplace satisfaction. Recently Goshen Health was ranked the 5th best hospital in Indiana.

We've come a long way from the small hospital on Fifth Street. Thoughtful contributions from people like you have enabled quality and growth of our medical care and services. Today treatments are approached proactively as we find new ways to engage in preventative care—whether through cancer research and clinical trials, or in-home telehealth monitoring. As the community's needs have changed, so has Goshen Health's approach to meeting those needs.

## *Your Community Hospital*

When the need for 24-hour health care was realized by the Goshen community back in 1906, community members came together with a solution. They started a community-wide campaign to raise funds to open the first Goshen Hospital on Fifth Street in 1913, raising \$17,000. When hospital capacity was exceeded, the community came together again to raise more than \$1 million in 1955 to build a larger hospital. Then in 1982 the community raised another \$1.9 million to fund a new addition. While much has changed in health care over the years, partnership within the community has remained strong. Together we've expanded services, purchased new equipment, developed new treatments, and expanded the hospital as the community has grown. These efforts have enabled Goshen Health to continue providing cutting-edge technology and services, close to home.

Goshen Health Foundation is here to bring people together to find solutions that benefit the health of our community. Creating and sustaining a healthy community requires consistent collaboration of healthcare providers and community partners. Together we are creating the future of health care.

**1906**  
The need for a hospital in Goshen with 24-hour access identified



**1913**  
Goshen Hospital open with capacity of 25 beds

**1922**  
Goshen Hospital purchases first x-ray

**1940**  
The hospital's board of directors identifies the need for a larger hospital. The search for land to build a new hospital begins.

**1946-1950**  
Community campaign raises over \$1 million for the new hospital and other health needs in Elkhart County



**1955**  
New hospital opens, providing 35 beds and 10 bassinets

**1923**  
Construction begins, increasing capacity to 50 beds

**1946**  
Property purchased for new location

**1953**  
Groundbreaking takes place on the edge of a cornfield on Main Street

**1966**  
Hospital expansion increases capacity to 91 beds



**1912**  
Community campaign raises \$17,000 to fund the first hospital

*(Former home and boarding house of Mrs. Rebecca Smith was purchased for \$6,000)*

**1921**  
Laura A. Kindling School of Nursing opens

**1923**  
Construction begins, increasing capacity to 50 beds

**1946**  
Property purchased for new location

**1953**  
Groundbreaking takes place on the edge of a cornfield on Main Street

**1966**  
Hospital expansion increases capacity to 91 beds

**1967**  
Hospital is extremely crowded with a census of 107%. Beds set up in hallways to accommodate patients. The need is clear for a larger hospital.



**1975**  
Hospital expansion adds new lobby, gift shop, coin cafeteria and expands physical therapy

**1980**  
Hospice Program begins



**1986**  
Home Care program begins  
Hospital purchases first CT

**1990**  
Healthcare reform begins in the U.S. The need for outpatient services begins to increase.

**1995**  
Goshen Health System was formed, including the hospital, Park Pharmacy, PrimeCare Physician Network, Indiana Lakes Managed Care Organization, Dunlap Urgent Care and Home Medical Equipment

**1998**  
Goshen Health System joined the world wide web, offering 24/7 information  
Nurse On Call Services begin. The area's only 24 hour bilingual health information, referral and nurse triage hotline.



**2000**  
Cancer Treatment Centers of America opens (now Goshen Center for Cancer Care)  
Need identified for comprehensive women's services

**2003**  
Community Health Needs Survey identifies top health concerns in Elkhart County: cancer, diabetes, obesity, heart issues, geriatrics, addiction, health care/drug costs and depression.

**2005**  
Centers for Rehabilitation Middlebury opens



**2012**  
Goshen Heart & Vascular Center opens

**2014**  
Goshen Center for Cancer Care at Warsaw opens



**2015**  
Community campaign raises \$2.2 million to expand access to care in partnership with Maple City Health Care Center



**1978**  
Medical Arts building opens  
Cardiac Rehabilitation Program begins  
Medical Staff identifies need for angiography, ultrasound and nuclear medicine

**1968**  
Two floors added to the hospital, increasing capacity to 166 beds

**1982**  
Community campaign exceeds \$1 million goal by \$900,000, raising funds for new addition.  
Hospital expansion provides new space for emergency department, five-station day surgery suite, imaging, laboratory and nuclear medicine

**1987**  
Occupational Therapy Services added

**1994**  
Hospital expansion adds 8 beds in Intensive Care Unit, 12 beds in Progressive Care Unit, a Pediatrics Unit and Cardiopulmonary Services. Circle of Caring Birthplace opens. Surgery expands, adding 8 private rooms.

**1996**  
Medical staff identifies need for cancer services



**2003**  
Retreat Women's Health Center opens  
Implementation of the electronic medical record begins



**2004**  
Hospital renovations begin, expanding emergency department, surgery and cancer center  
Team: Bariatrics opens  
Centers for Rehabilitation at Anglemeyer Clinic Nappanee opens

**2012**  
Community Health Needs Survey identifies top health concerns in Elkhart County: access to primary care, access to mental health services, obesity, smoking, diabetes and cancer

**2013**  
Syracuse Family Medicine expanded to offer onsite orthopedics, physical therapy, heart and vascular care and OB/GYN

**2015**  
Community Health Needs Survey identifies top health concerns in Elkhart County: access to health services, access to mental health services, treatment of chronic disease, smoking, obesity and cancer  
In-home telehealth monitoring begins



**2016**  
Family Medicine and Urgent Care Center opens  
Goshen Hospital offers 122 beds, over 200 physicians and is ranked 5th in Indiana by U.S. News and World Report

# Make a Better Tomorrow

For Goshen Health, providing world-class care locally means a commitment to people in our community to not only identify needs, but respond with innovative solutions. ### CANCER TREATMENT

**More than 15 years ago we** opened our own comprehensive, multi-disciplinary cancer center to bring world-class cancer treatment close to home. In 2014, we added a second location in Warsaw to meet the needs of those traveling for care.

**Our dedicated team of** research experts and oncologists are working to discover potential breakthrough therapies, medicines and cancer treatments, offering the latest clinical trials to patients and providing unmatched care in our region.



### OBESITY

**Offering both medically managed** weight loss and bariatric surgery, our integrated system of support includes an entire team of weight loss experts, a modern facility, on-site fitness center and dedicated specialists equipped with the most advanced research and technology.



### TREATMENT OF CHRONIC DISEASES

**Opened a comprehensive heart** and vascular care center allowing our board-certified cardiologists, surgeons, neurologists, and radiologists to work together in one place.

**Remote STEMI Activation ambulance** system implemented to better prepare hospital staff for a heart attack patient's arrival and treatment needs.

**In-home telehealth monitors used** to interact with patients, allowing clinical staff to provide timely care without the patient leaving home.



### TOBACCO CESSATION

**Led by a certified tobacco treatment** specialist, our program includes in-patient education and follow-up, out-patient sessions, school and community offerings, and a free, weekly support group. We focus on nicotine addiction and physical dependence, and mental and social aspects of tobacco use.



### ACCESS TO CARE

**Partnered with Maple City** Health Care Center to expand access to care through a community campaign that funded a second location, providing a medical home for an additional 1,200 patients in our community.

**Expanded family practice** office to include an urgent care center, offering extended hours and allowing patients greater access to care.



### ACCESS TO MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

**In partnership with Oaklawn,** Goshen Health implemented a video conferencing program to immediately connect patients with a live counselor without driving to a separate facility.
